- The Department of Education submits report to NDRRMC re: DRRM/School Safety as a member
  of the said council and in accordance with RA10121 which reflect the country's' commitment to
  the Sendai Framework DRR (SFDRR) and to the global Comprehensive School Safety
  Framework (CSSF).
- The use of the Comprehensive School Safety Monitoring Tool was included in the Division DRRM
  Training last August 2017 (held at DTC), and all School Heads & SDRRMCs (participants) were
  oriented and were given both hard and e-copy (in CD). This monitoring tool aims to:
  - Establish the comprehensive baseline with respect to the implementation of the 3 Pillars of DepEd's Comprehensive DRRM in Education Framework (DO37, s. 2015).
  - b) Set the school's DRRM targets for 3 years, based on the baseline; and
  - c) Track the annual progress of the school with respect to its targets;
- 3. In view of this, we are tasked to come up with the baseline data needed, subject for DRRM assessment and analysis in preparation for the much needed intervention in School DRRM implementation, particularly the 2017 baseline and 2018-2020 target, which is due on March 30, 2018 to the RO/CO DRRMS Office.
- 4. Schools are required to fill-up the CSS Monitoring Tool with the School DRRM Committee and submit it to the Division office.
- 5. All signed reports (scanned & e-copies) should be submitted to the Division thru e-mail: marjorle.rodriguez001@deped.gov.ph on or before March 28, 2018 for consolidation, assessment and analysis prior to submission to RO/CO.
- 6. Meanwhile, all supporting documents shall be compiled and shall be included in the (School DRRM Portfolio), validation of which shall be in April 2018. While the validation for CSS 2018 progress shall be Quarter 4 this year.
- 7. For your information, guidance and strict compliance.

## COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL SAFETY MONITORING TOOL

This school level Comprehensive School Safety Monitoring Tool is aligned with the Sendai Framework for DRR (SEDRR) and the global Comprehensive School Safety Framework (CSSF) developed by the UN International Strategy for Disaster Reduction (UNISDR). As a signatory to the SEDRR, the Philippine Government is expected to report to the UNISDR its accomplishment in implementing the SEDRR. In line with this, the Department of Education is required to report its accomplishment in implementing Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM)/School Safety to the Hatiphal DRRM Council (NDRRMC) as a member of the said council, and in accordance to RA 10121 (Philippine DRRM Act of 2010) which reflects the country's commitment to SEDRR.

This Monitoring Tool aims to: 1) establish the baseline with respect to the implementation of the 3 Pillars of DepEd's Comprehensive DRRM in Education Framework (Do 37, s. 2015); 2) Set the School's DRRM targets for 3 years, based on the baseline; and, 3) Track the annual progress of the school with respect to its targets.

The 1st column indicates the particular Priority for Action in the SFDRR that are related to the Targets of the global CSSF in the 2nd column. The 3rd column indicates DepEd's Comprehensive School Safety indicators at the school level that are related to columns 1 and 2. The school level DepEd indicators are based on the Department's Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) policies and the School DRRM Manual (SDRRM). The 4th column sets the baseline of the school with respect to DepEd's incicators in the 3rd column. The 5th column sets the targets/plans of the school based on its baseline. The remaining columns will be accomplished by the school on an annual basis to incicate progress against the targets set for 3 years.
