- In view of the DOST-PAG-ASA Weather forecast, TROPICAL CYCLONE WARNING SIGNAL TCWS #2 (61-120kph expected in 24 hrs) was raised over the following areas: Cagayan, Abra, Kalinga, Ilocos Sur, Mountain Province, Ifugao, La Union, Benguet, Nueva Vizcaya, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Nueva Ecija, Northern Quezon including Polillo Island, and Southern Aurora
- 2. This Division calls to all public and private schools, all teaching and non-teaching personnel to make all the necessary safety preparations and precautions to lessen the impact of the typhoon. All Division/School officials are advised to secure their respective offices/schools including all equipment, furniture, books, school records and important documents.
- 3. All Division/School DRRM Committees are activated effective immediately. All Division personnel/monitoring officials are instructed to ensure follow up and monitoring to their respective Area of Responsibility (AOR). All Division Unit heads are advised to ensure personnel tracking and give updates to the Division through the DRRM Info Chat /SDO Division Personnel. While School Heads/School DRRM Coordinators are expected to give the necessary situation updates (flooding's, evacuees encampment/decampment, and related incidents) to the Division DRRM Coordinator.
- Schools are alerted in case of the community's need for evacuation center. Please ensure close
  coordination with the local barangay for the matter. Pre-emptive evacuation will take place within the
  day.
- 5. In addition, all non-teaching and non-teaching personnel who shall be called to duty in the evacuation center and those who are actively engaged in coordination and management and monitoring (before, during and after) the said hazard shall be entitled to service credits in accordance with DepEd 53, 2003 for teaching personnel and Compensatory Time-Off (CTO) for non-teaching personnel as per CSC & DMB Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2004.
- Call for extra diligence must be observed at all times. All are encouraged to keep monitoring for updates, stay safe and continue praying for everyone's safety.



Preparedness Measures for Rainy Season

The rainy season has officialy started. Please follow the safety tips as prescribed by DepEd Memo 108 s.2016



Increase preparedness and safety of all school personnel and learners



Safety of school properties, learning materials and vital school records from any possible occurrence of hazards to enable learners' continued access to education is a must



Ensure that school buildings can withstand heavy rain and strong winds. Anchor the facilities built at ground level with guy wires to strengthen the stability of the structure



Identify a safe storage area for safekeeping of learning materials, teachers' manuals, vital school records and equipment. Elevated room is ideal to ensure protection from rain and flood



Turn off and unplug electrical equipment and appliance when not in use



Equip schools with first aid kits, flashlights, megaphones, and other necessary supplies that may be needed in times of emergency. Ensure that these are safely stored and easy to access



Prepare the school for a possible use as evacuation centers and ensure that the staff-in-charge of the keys are easily accessible



Regularly conduct school disaster response drills or simulation, post emergency hotline numbers in classrooms and offices, update database of students and their family contact details; and prepare contingency plan




