#### RATIONALE:

Pursuant to Section 43 of Article IV of Republic Act No. 9165 otherwise known as the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act 2002 and based on DepEd Memorandum 200, s. 2016, the Department of Education reiterates its support in Strengthening the National Drug Education Program (NDEP).

- 1. Develop skills and understanding among students, faculty, and school administrators in initiation active responses for a drug-free school.
- 2. Assess the extent of program implementation in the division.
- 3. Motivate program implementers to manifest enthusiasm, leadership and deeper commitments to the implementations of the program; and
- 4. Increase community awareness and participation hence, maintaining a fully drug-free environment in the school, home, workplace, and community.
- 5. Support and sustain the services in the *Barkada*-adopted concepts among educators, professionals, families, work forces, peer groups and other sectors; and
- 6. Give Recognition to the best implementers.
