

- The time allotment for in-person classes shall be based on DepEd Order No.21, s. 2019.
- e. Schools are allowed to implement double-shift classes subject to the provisions of DepEd Order No. 41, s. 2012.
- f. Schools are directed to implement a contextualized set of strategies and interventions as part of the Learning Recovery and Continuity Plan. The LRCP shall focus on learning remediation, socio-emotional functioning, mental health, & well-being, and professional development for teachers.
- g. Teachers shall develop and administer diagnostic tests to identify the learning gaps of learners. Likewise, the Phil-IRI & FLAT shall be administered during the first two months of classes (pretest) and during the last two months of the school year (posttest).
- The Most Essential Learning Competencies (MELCs) shall continue to apply for SY 2022-2023.
- Classroom assessment shall follow DO 8, s. 2015 or the Policy Guidelines on Classroom Assessment for the K to 12 Basic Education Program.
- The Multi-Factored Assessment Tool (MFAT) shall be administered to Grade 1 learners a month after the opening of classes as per DO 29, s. 2018.
- k. The provisions of OUCI-2020-307 entitled Suggested Measures to Foster Academic Ease during the COVID 19 Pandemic shall continue to apply as part of promoting mental wellness.
- Career guidance activities which may be held in-person or hybrid shall be conducted between August and December to guide junior high school learners in making informed career choices.
- m. Teachers handling full face-to-face classes shall prepare Daily Lesson Plan/Log as per DO 42, s. 2016. Those handling blended learning classes shall continue to use the Weekly Learning Plan or they may also prepare DLL (for F2F sessions) and Home Learning Plan (for distance learning sessions).
- n. School canteens may resume their operation subject to the provisions of DO 8, s. 2007 and DO 13, s. 2017. However, schools shall establish guidelines to ensure strict adherence to health protocols.
- o. There shall be no discrimination between vaccinated and unvaccinated school personnel and learners. Especially under COVID 19 Alert Level 1 status, unvaccinated teachers may return to the traditional style of teaching starting August 22, 2022. Same provision applies to non-teaching personnel. However, DepEd personnel are highly

encouraged to be vaccinated since studies suggest that parents feel safer if the schools of their children have a high rate of vaccination. Moreover, regular submission of negative antigen test results may be required under higher COVID 19 alert level status.

- p. Physical distancing shall be implemented whenever possible.
- q. There is no set class size for each classroom. School heads, however, are directed to observe due diligence in setting class size in their respective schools in consideration of the prevailing condition in their areas.
- The SDO thru the Monitoring teams are directed to conduct monitoring activities to ensure the compliance of schools with the provisions enumerated above.
