



Totally Damaged	80% - <mark>1</mark> 00%	When all applicable components are for Total Replacement OR 2)     When estimated cost of repair exceeds the budget ceiling
Partially Damaged (Major)	10% - 79%	When all or several applicable components are needing Major Repair AND 2) When estimated cost of repair does not exceed the budget ceiling
Partially Damaged (Minor)	1% - 9%	1) When all or several applicable components are needing Minor Repair AND 2) When estimated cost of repair does not exceed 10% of the budget ceiling AND 3) No damage to columns, beams and exterior walls
