

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



SEARCH FOR THE BEST SDG BOOTH EXHIBIT

I. Guidelines

- 1. There shall be 17 booths representing the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). Each district/secondary school/private school will represent one (1) SDG.
- 2. The booths shall showcase best practices supporting the SDG.
- 3. Each competing district or school shall be provided with an 8 x 8 meter space to accommodate any visual and auditory materials for exhibit to showcase their practices supporting the SDG. Participants may coordinate to their respective sponsors for the materials that will be used for the design of the booths.
- 4. There shall be simple games (pakulo) in every booth for the spectators to experience and enjoy. The contingents should coordinate with the sponsors for the freebies or prizes.
- 5. The signage of the booth shall only indicate the specific SDG assigned to each contingent. The booths shall not bear district number/school name or any identification of the district/school to preserve the integrity of the judging.
- The participating district/secondary school/private school should setup their booth on February 4, 2024. There shall be in - charge of the booths the entire duration of the summit to answer questions or queries.
- 7. A panel of three (3) judges shall screen and select 3 winners based on the criteria.





ESSAY-WRITING (SECONDARY) ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

GUIDELINES/MECHANICS:

- 1. There shall be sixteen (16) contestants for the Essay-writing Contest in the Secondary Level on Sustainable Development Goals. Eight (8) from Public Schools and Eight (8) from Private Schools and they must be certified Grade 7-10 learners from Dagupan City.
- 2. After the announcement of the central theme of the contest, participants are given one (1) hour to finish their essay. The essay must be written in English with maximum of 1000 words excluding prepositions/conjunctions.
- 3. The contestants will be given numbers which they will write at the upper righthand corner of their entries.
- 4. The secretariat shall provide the writing materials. Only black or blue ballpen will be allowed.
- 5. The contest facilitator shall announce the following during the contest time: last thirty minutes, last fifteen minutes, last five minutes and last one minute.
- 6. After the contest work period, all entries will be submitted to the contest facilitator.
- 7. Panel of judges shall be composed of one chairperson and at least two members.
- 8. After the adjudication and tabulation of results, the Panel of Judges shall announce and award the winners of the contest. The decision of the Panel of Judges shall be final and non-appealable.
- 9. Top three (3) winners will receive cash prizes and Certificate of Recognition.



3. Music Requirements

a. The music used in the routine must be from three (3) to five (5) minutes.

c. There is no maximum or minimum number of songs/recordings that may be used in the routine and it may be edited to enhance choreography and personal performance.

d. The competition music must not contain inappropriate, lewd, or offensive language.

4. Inevitable Circumstances

a. These are occurrences beyond the control of the crew that affect their ability to perform at the beginning or any time in a routine. An extraordinary circumstance is not limited to the following:

(1) Incorrect music is played or cued,

(2) Music problems due to equipment malfunction,

(3) Disturbances caused by general equipment failure.

b. In case the routine is stopped by an extraordinary circumstance, the management and/or judges will review the situation, and upon confirming a decision and correcting the problem, the crew will be reintroduced, and will be allowed to re-start their routine.

5. Medical Attention and Condition

a. Participants who are experiencing bad health conditions such as cough, runny nose, fever and flu, skin rashes are not allowed to join the competition in compliance to the minimum health and safety protocols.

 In cases of injuries or serious disabilities, it is the responsibility of the group members, manager, or choreographer to report a group member's

injury to the management.

c. If at any time, prior to or during competition, a group member becomes ill, or his/her physical or emotional condition is at risk by participating, he/she may be declared ineligible to compete, and may be disqualified from the competition. The management reserves the right to prohibit any competitor who appears to have such serious disability or injury or needs medical attention.

- 5. Participants will be given opportunity to block their routine on stage a day before the competition at CSI Atrium. Those who are absent/late for their designated blocking time will not be allowed to block on stage at a later time. Entry forms will be submitted to the contest facilitator.
- A panel of judges shall determine the winners based on the given criteria.
 Any violation of the foregoing rules may cause 1point deduction per violation on the final score. The decision of the panel shall be final and irrevocable.
- 7. The order of performance shall be determined by the management via drawing of lots before the competition starts.
- 8. The top three (3) winners will receive cash prizes and Certificate of Recognition. The none winners will receive Certificate of Participation.


B. Contest Mechanics

1. Performance & Stage Rules

a. The duration of the dance should be a minimum of 3 minutes, and a maximum of 5 minutes. Deduction of one (1) point from the total score for every excess of thirty (30) seconds shall be applied.

- b. Any kind of hip hop dance is allowed (locking, popping, krumping, house, stepping, breakdance, wacking, tutting, vogueing, party dances, hip hop choreography) or any kind of dance with hip hop as their focal thought of choreography.
- c. No vulgarity, obscenity, and explicit contents are allowed.
- d. Pyrotechnics or dangerous stunts are not allowed.

2. Costumes and Props

- a. Costumes must be decent.
- b. All costume malfunction making team members being exposed are grounds for deductions. Please make sure to have dress rehearsals prior to competition to avoid any costume problems.
- c. Props that are not considered as an integral part of a crew's attire are prohibited (ex. canes, chairs, tambourines, musical instruments).
- d. Attire may include accessories such as hats, scarves, caps, gloves, jewelries, etc. Removing pieces of clothing during the performance is permitted provided it is not offensive or out of character.

3. Music Requirements

- a. The music used in the routine must be from three (3) to five (5) minutes.
- b. Participants' competition music must be submitted through email at ferrermaricris@deped.gov.ph on or before February 5, 2024 @ 5:00pm. Please follow the format below in the submission of the soft copies of your group music.

File Format: Group Name only
Example: MobDanceCrew

- c. There is no maximum or minimum number of songs/recordings that may be used in the routine and it may be edited to enhance choreography and personal performance.
- d. The competition music must not contain inappropriate, lewd, or offensive language.


4. Inevitable Circumstances


- a. These are occurrences beyond the control of the crew that affect their ability to perform at the beginning or any time in a routine. An extraordinary circumstance is not limited to the following:
 - (1) Incorrect music is played or cued,
 - (2) Music problems due to equipment malfunction,
 - (3) Disturbances caused by general equipment failure.
- b. In case the routine is stopped by an extraordinary circumstance, the management and/or judges will review the situation, and upon confirming a decision and correcting the problem, the crew will be reintroduced, and will be allowed to re-start their routine.

5. Medical Attention and Condition

a. Participants who are experiencing bad health conditions such as cough, runny nose, fever and flu, skin rashes are not allowed to join the competition in compliance to the minimum health and safety protocols.

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b. In cases of injuries or serious disabilities, it is the responsibility of the group members, manager, or choreographer to report a group member's injury to the management.


c. If at any time, prior to or during competition, a group member becomes ill, or his/her physical or emotional condition is at risk by participating, he/she may be declared ineligible to compete, and may be disqualified from the competition. The management reserves the right to prohibit any competitor who appears to have such serious disability or injury or needs medical attention.






