

CONDUCT OF CHILDREN'S SUMMIT 2024

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Chiefs of Functional Division- CID & SGOD Education Program Supervisors Public Schools District Supervisors School Heads (Public and Private Schools) All Others Concerned

- Pursuant to Republic Act No. 10661, The National Children's Month (NCM) or also known as "Buwan ng mga Bata" in the Philippines is annually celebrated every November to commemorate the adoption of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) on the 20th day of November, 1989. It seeks to sustain the promotion and protection of children's rights.
- In line with this, the office announces the conduct of the Children's Summit 2024 on November 6-8, 2024 at Jimmy L. Fernandez Center (CSI Stadia), Lucao District, Dagupan City. This year's theme is "Break the Prevalence, End the Violence: Protecting Children, Creating a Safe Philippines!"

- Enhance understanding of children's rights and the importance of creating a safe environment for all children in the Philippines.
- Foster partnerships among various stakeholders, including educators, parents, government agencies, and NGOs, to address issues of violence against children.
- Provide a platform for sharing successful strategies and initiatives aimed at preventing violence and protecting children's welfare.
- Encourage active participation of children and youth in discussions and activities aimed at advocating for their rights and safety.
- Create and disseminate materials and resources that support child protection initiatives and educate communities about violence prevention.

K-POP Dance Contest Guidelines

1. Eligibility:

Open to all Grade 4-6 learners officially enrolled in public or private schools within the SDO-Dagupan City.

Each group must consist of 6 to 8 members only.

A total of 16 groups will compete in the event:

- One group will represent each of the eight districts from public schools.
- One group will represent each of the eight participating private schools.

2. Registration :

Note: Late registrations will not be accepted.

3. Guidelines:

a. Required Documents

- · Certificate of enrollment, signed by the school Principal or Registrar.
- · Entry form
- Waiver/Parent's Consent Form.

b. Performance Details

- Choose a song from a K-Pop artist or group (original choreography or covers are allowed).
- Performances should be between 1.5 to 3 minutes in length. A one-point deduction will be applied for every 30 seconds exceeding the time limit.
- All performances must be child-friendly.
- Costumes are encouraged but not required.

c. Event Procedures

- Arrive at Hall 3, CSI Stadia, at least 30 minutes before your scheduled performance.
- Check in at the registration desk upon arrival
- Participants will have the opportunity to block their routine on stage a
 day prior to the competition (10:00-11:00 AM) at Hall 3, CSI Stadia.
 Latecomers will not be allowed to block their routine at a later time.
- Submit entry forms to the contest facilitator during the blocking rehearsal.

d. Judging and Performance Order

 A panel of judges will select the winners based on the established criteria.

- · The panel's decisions are final and irrevocable.
- Violations of the rules will result in a one-point deduction per infraction.
- The order of performances will be determined by a drawing of lots before the competition begins.
- Videos and photos of performances may be shared on social media hence a signed media consent, release and waiver form must be signed by the participants.
- Participants must be in good health and aware of their physical abilities.
- Adhere to all safety guidelines during rehearsals and performances.

1. Eligibility:

 Open to all Grade 9 learners officially enrolled in public or private schools within SDO-Dagupan City.

There will be one contestant representing each of the eight participating schools, both public and private, resulting in a total of 16 contestants competing in the event.

 of the event coordinator.
